# **GALLERY NEWS AUTUMN 2021**

#### FROM THE GALLERY DIRECTOR

Hello and welcome to the Autumn 2021 edition of the Cowra Regional Art Gallery Newsletter. I'm pleased to report that the recent summer exhibitions and activities received over 2,000 visitors, with many visiting the Gallery and Cowra for the first time. These exhibitions included a selection of recent acquisitions from the Gallery collection, together with a survey exhibition featuring paintings, prints and artist's books by renowned artist Yvonne Boag (a previous winner of the Calleen Art Award). This exhibition was carefully curated by Akky van Ogtrop and included an outreach display of artist's books in the Cowra Library. Since early February 2021 the Gallery presented the outstanding touring exhibition Concrete: art design architecture exploring innovative ways that concrete is being used by 21 artists, designers and architects from across Australia. Other activities included summer workshops for children and adult workshops on concrete casting with Adelaide based artist Anna Horne. We also presented two curator/artist floor talk events which were recorded and are now available on the Gallery website. These activities have received over 4,000 online visitors to the Gallery website and 1,400 video views.


Commencing on 27 March the Gallery is presenting the exhibition John Gollings: the history of the built world. John Gollings is Australia's pre-eminent photographer of the built environment. For the past 50 years he has been synthesising his joint interests in photography and architecture to explore the cultural construction of social spaces. Including a selection of his well known documentation of new buildings and cityscapes, this outstanding survey of over 90 significant photographic images comprises a broader context also including projects concerned with architectural history and heritage. This touring exhibition is presented with the support of the Monash Gallery of Art. Images of the exhibition will be available on the Gallery website at a later date after the launch.

### **CONCRETE CASTING WORKSHOP WITH ANNA HORNE**





On Saturday 13 March 2021 we had the delight of hosting South Australian artist, Anna Horne, for two special concrete casting workshops. Participants were led by Anna in making sculptures cast in concrete and plaster, utilising moulds made from unexpected everyday materials.

Anna Horne is a featured artist in the touring exhibition CONCRETE: art design architecture. Her artworks reference the domestic and architectural space by utilising both industrial and commonplace materials within the context of contemporary sculpture. She combines structural materials like concrete, floor vinyl and styrofoam with found objects such as beach balls, plastic bags and wine sacks to create sculptures exploring tension, contradiction and balance.

A huge thank you to Anna for her generosity in time and expertise, and thank you to all who participated.
