FROM THE GALLERY DIRECTOR

Hello and welcome to the final Edition of the Cowra Regional Art Gallery Newsletter for 2022. During August/ September/October the Gallery presented two major touring exhibitions. Firstly, the stimulating and highly popular **Dobell Drawing Prize #22** (on tour from the National Art School, Sydney) showcasing the work of 44 leading and emerging artists and secondly the inspiring and exceptional survey exhibition **Living Treasures: Masters of Australian Craft - Prue Venables** (on tour from the Australian Design Centre, Sydney). The Gallery also presented **The Makers Film Festival** an "Art After Dark" event in late July at the Cowra Civic Centre. The program featured 24 short films exploring traditional and contemporary craft practices first presented at the 2021 Indian Ocean Craft Triennial, Perth WA.

During October/November the Gallery presented the **Calleen Art Award 2022** acquisitive prize for painting worth \$25,000 supported by the Calleen Trust. As at 13 November just under 700 visitors have been to the Gallery to see the exhibition (and Cowra) many for the first time which is always pleasing.

Coming up at the Gallery is the regional young artists exhibition *upstART22* showcasing works by 94 students in stages 5 and 6 (Years 9, 10, 11 and 12) from ten high schools in the region.

Commencing on 18 December is the exhibition **Connection:** Artist/Master Printer introducing the individual and collaborative practice of Basil Hall (Canberra), artist and founder Basil Hall Editions, Michael Kempson (Sydney), artist and founder Cicada Press and Ron McBurnie (Townsville) artist and publisher Monsoon Publishing. This exhibition is presented by Cowra Regional Art Gallery and curatored by Akky van Ogtrop.

OPENING NIGHT - CALLEEN ART AWARD 2022

Always a favourite exhibition with the Cowra community and visitors to the Cowra Regional Art Gallery, the Calleen Art Award was founded in 1977 by Cowra art patron and collector Mrs Patricia Fagan OAM. The Calleen Art Award is an acquisitive art prize which encourages originality, creativity and excellence in the in a myriad of painting styles and subjects.

The announcement of the Calleen Art Award 2022 winner took place at the Gallery on Saturday 8 October 2022 with over 80 visitors present including many of the 49 finalists in attendance. Guest speakers were Cr Bill West, Mayor, Cowra Shire Council who officially opened the exhibition and the Award Judge, Rhonda Davis, Senior Curator, Macquarie University Art Gallery who announced the winner and spoke about the exhibition and the winning painting. The award certificate and prize money worth \$25,000 were presented by Jenni and Peter Fagan from the Calleen Trust.

This year's winner is Canberra based artist Derek O'Connor for his painting Weather Report which will join the Calleen Collection (the Gallery's foundation collection). This intriguing and compelling collection celebrating previous "Calleen" winners (since 1977) is a collection of regional and national significance.

The Calleen Art Award 2022 exhibition continues at the Gallery until 20 November. It is a high-quality and exciting exhibition consisting of a diverse range of thoughtful and challenging paintings. Visitors can vote in the People's Choice Award announced at the end of the exhibition.

Judge's comments

I was immensely honoured to be this year's judge of the prestigious Calleen Art Award. The high calibre of the finalists works on display made the selection process and final decision of the winner very difficult.

I kept on coming back to Derek O'Connor's large abstract painting titled 'Weather Report'. The painting divested with an underlying force by the virtue of its activated surface, with the skilled and sensuous layering and subsequent erasure of paint in its overlapping colours and shapes brings about a three-dimensional effect that draws you into the painting space. The subtle shifts of colour and form lend a sense of discovery for the viewer to further contemplate their own experience and meaning they might assign to 'Weather Report'. As O'Connor says he wants to 'invite the viewer to experience, rather than read my work'. Rhonda Davis
