At present the Cowra Regional Art Gallery remains open and will continue to present an exciting program of engaging exhibitions and stimulating outreach and public activities as promoted, in accordance with COVID -19 Public Health orders. The Gallery's main priority is the health and wellbeing of our visitors, staff and volunteers.

The program highlights for 2022 include the Gallery hosting the exciting Archibald Prize 2021 touring exhibition; a Cowra Regional Art Gallery Collection exhibition with a special focus on works by women artists; the presentation of the national tour of innovative and stimulating works by finalists of the Dobell Drawing Prize #22; a living treasures exhibition from the Australian Design Centre and the highly acclaimed Calleen Art Award acquisitive painting prize for 2022. 
