Archibald Prize 2016 Regional Tour

Prestigious and controversial, the Archibald Prize is Australia's foremost portraiture prize. It is awarded to the best painting of a notable Australian and is a veritable who's who of Australian culture, from politicians and celebrities to sporting heroes and artists.

In accordance with the bequest established in 1919 by Jules François Archibald (1856–1919) the founding editor of The Bulletin the Archibald Prize was first awarded in 1921. The Archibald Prize is a non-acquisitive competition and aims to foster portraiture, support artists and perpetuate the memory of great Australians.

The winner of the 2017 Calleen Art Award received \$20,000 in prize money made possible by the generous support of the Calleen Trust and the winning painting Audery by Melbourne based artist Zai Kuang became part of the Calleen Collection at the Cowra Regional Art Gallery.

Stephen Bird: From Painter to Bastard Son of Royal Doulton

A Wollongong Art Gallery touring exhibition



An enticing exhibition, from its evocative and amusingly irreverent title to its bizarre and often comically hybrid forms and colourful images, this survey of ceramics; objects and works on paper uncovered Stephen Bird's diverse art practice over 20 years and its influence on his well-known ceramic works.

These works, including paper constructions; watercolours; ceramics and mosaics have not previously been shown in Australia and includes commemorative plates and Toby-style jugs which meld an Australian sardonic humour with traditional English Industrial pottery forms.

5 August to 13 August 2017

Behind the Wire - Cowra Breakout/Cowra POW Camp

From 5 August each year, for over 50 years, Japanese and Australian survivors and descendants have gathered in Cowra to commemorate, through memorial services and special events the "Cowra Breakout" which took place on 5 August 1944. On that day more than 1,100 Japanese Prisoners of War attempted a mass escape from the Cowra POW camp. A total of 334 Japanese POWs made it out of the camp, while 231 Japanese and four Australian servicemen were killed in the Breakout attempt and subsequent round-up.

The exhibition *Our History Our Heritage* displayed a diverse collection of precious Cowra POW camp artefacts and objects including memorabilia and photographs. Restored alter panels created by Italian Prisoners of War and which were originally housed in the Italian Chapel at the Camp were also showcased.

Public Program

The exhibition opening night took place Friday, 4 August 2017 and was opened by Cr Bill West, Mayor Cowra Shire Council and Stephen Copland installation artist. Guest speaker was Dr Roslyn Russell, Historian, writer, Museum Curator and Chair of the UNESCO Australian Memory of the World Committee. Over 60 people attended the opening.

Calleen Collection: 40 Year Anniversary

The Calleen Collection 1977–2009 consists of 35 works and is the legacy of Cowra resident and arts patron, Mrs Patricia Fagan, OAM. In 1976, the Calleen Trust made its first donation of prize money for an acquisitive painting award which is now known at the Calleen Art Award. This award has grown to be a substantial annual art prize, open to artists across Australia. The first winning work was displayed in the then Council Chambers. Highlights of the collection are works that reflect predominant painting styles in Australia during the past 20 years, together with a strong regional flavour.

2017 Operation Art - Cowra Library

Operation Art is an initiative of the Children's Hospital at Westmead in collaboration with the Department of Education and Communities. This program encourages students from Kindergarten to Year 10 in schools across NSW to create artworks for children in hospital. It is an important statewide visual arts exhibition that focuses on creating a positive environment to aid the healing and recovery process of young patients. The touring exhibition is comprised of 50 colourful artworks using mediums including painting, drawing, collage and photography.
