

SUMMER WORKSHOPS FOR CHILDREN









23 and 24 January 2018

The Summer Art Workshops for Children are designed by tutors with professional art experience. There were two workshop sessions per day over two days for two hours per session covering a range of art activities such as paintings, drawing, printmaking and sculpture in a fun environment as well as allowing the development of individual skills. Age groups are 7 - 9 years and 10 -12 years. Usually 30 - 40 children from the community attend these workshops. Local artist/tutors were Trudi Refshauge and Catherine Bennett.

10 February to 18 March 2018

Mandy Martin: Homeground

This twenty-year survey exhibition concentrates on Mandy Martin's deep unease about the landscape in which we live. Environmental issues relating to water security, the impact of the region's coal-fired power stations and open cut mines are central concerns.

Each of the works in the exhibition have been carefully selected, creating a suite of works that distil the essence of Martin's practice since she moved to Mandurama in the Central West in 1995. The survey includes examples of Martin's collaborative practice including paintings with the indigenous artist Trisha Carroll and digital projections with the Canberra based artist and curator, Alexander Boynes.

The Lady and The Unicorn: A Collaboration Between Arthur Boyd and Peter Porter

The Lady and The Unicorn, is an astonishing series of images, with violent episodes, tragedy and triumph, foregrounds the unicorn, isolated by its uniqueness and set apart by its fate. The series highlights Boyd's command of the technically complex and demanding process of intaglio printmaking" says Deborah Ely, Bundanon Trust CEO. "This exhibition also encapsulates the story of Arthur and Peter's collaboration, a unique and generative relationship."

The etchings and painting in the exhibition are all from the Bundanon Trust collection. Bundanon (located near Nowra, NSW) is Arthur and Yvonne Boyd's gift to the people of Australia, accepted by the Australian Government in 1993. Today the Trust supports arts practice and engagement with the arts through residencies, education, exhibition and performance programs, and preserves the natural and cultural heritage of the sites.

Objet D' Art

Objet D' Art was a collaboration between historic car collector Jeff Brown and the artist Robert Clinch. The exhibition showcased an iconic 1960s Australian Sports car, the Goggomobil Dart, transformed into an art object by contemporary realist painter Robert Clinch who painstakingly hand painted the car over a period of five months with his signature paper darts. The dart motif has persisted in Clinch's paintings since 1985 and signifies imagination, transience, purity and fragility. Accompanying the car, the exhibition also included detailed sketches, test panels and a documentary video about the project.



Calleen Art Award

The Calleen Art Award encourages originality, creativity and artistic excellence and is an acquisitive national painting prize in any subject and style established in 1977 by Mrs Patricia Fagan OAM. The winner of the 2018 Calleen Art Award received \$20,000 in prize money made possible by the generous support of the Calleen Trust and the winning work became part of the Calleen Collection at the Cowra Regional Art Gallery. The winner was Cairns-based and Torres Strait Islander artist Brian Robinson.

A People's Choice Award (non-acquisitive) was awarded at the end of the exhibition with the winner receiving \$500.

Remember Me - The Lost Diggers of Vignacourt

The small French village of Vignacourt was always behind the front lines and for much of the First World War it was a staging point, casualty clearing station and recreation area for troops of all nationalities moving up to and then back from the battlefields on the Somme. Remember Me: the Lost Diggers of Vignacourt tells the story of how one enterprising photographer took the opportunity of this passing traffic to establish a business taking portrait photographs.

Public Program

An exhibition opening took place Friday, 20 July and was opened by guest speaker Major General (Retired) Brian Dawson AM.

A floor talk was presented on Saturday, 21 July by Joanne Smedley, Curator of Photographs in the Photographs, Film and Sound Section at the Australian War Memorial. This talk included key stories in the Vignacourt collection; how it was uncovered, its journey to Australia and the extensive research that was undertaken by both Memorial staff and members of the public.

Art Express 2018

ARTEXPRESS is an annual series of exhibitions that showcase outstanding works by Higher School Certificate Visual Arts students from schools in NSW. The exhibition was on show at Cowra Regional Art Gallery and featured a selection of artworks submitted for the 2017 NSW Higher School Certificate Visual Arts examination from both Government and non-government schools.

Public Program

An exhibition opening took place Saturday, 8 September 2018 and was opened by Mr David Lloyd, Director of Educational Leadership, Cowra Network Public Schools, NSW on behalf of the NSW Department of Education. The JamFactory Icon exhibition Gerry Wedd: Kitschen Man showcased artist Gerry Wedd's handbuilt and wheel-thrown ceramics that brim with dry wit and shift from the humorous to the darkly disturbing.

This exhibition provided Cowra and Central West art lovers with a rare opportunity to experience first-hand the works of one of Australia's most outstanding and influential craft practitioners.

2018 upstART – Exhibition and Awards

UpstART is a must-see exhibition and awards for students in Years 10, 11 and 12 at secondary schools in the Central West. It celebrates the achievements and creativity of the young artists from the region, and is a unique opportunity for them to display their artwork in a leading public gallery.

The 2018 upstART exhibition included an impressive showcase of painting, drawing, photography, printmaking, mixed media and sculpture by over 80 students from nine high schools in the region. The participating schools were Boorowa Central School, Cowra High School, Dubbo School of Distance Education, Hennessy Catholic College, Kinross Wolaroi School, Molong Central School, Parkes High School and St Raphael's Catholic School.

UpstART is presented with the tremendous assistance of the art teachers from the participating schools.
