

Public Programs

The exhibition, presented by the Gallery in partnership with Macquarie University, featured a diverse range of new works including painting, photography, sound and installation by ten artists offering fresh interpretations of the mermaid including whimsical mermaid imagery and folklore as well as new associations that connect contemporary issues with particular places and circumstances opened on Saturday, December 15, 2018.

23 and 24 January 2019 – Children's Workshops

The annual Summer Art Workshops for Children are designed by tutors with professional art experience. For 2019 there were two workshop sessions per day over two days for two hours per session covering a range of art activities such as paintings, drawing, printmaking and sculpture in a fun environment also allowing the development of individual skills. Age groups are 7 - 9 years and 10 -12 years. Four workshops for children including mosaics and creative collage were held over two days with local artist/tutors Libby Murray and Catherine Bennett. A total of 26 children from the community attended the workshops.

23 February to 28 April 2019 – Exhibition

WAR and PIECED: The Annette Gero Collection of Quilts from Military Fabrics



A blockbuster exhibition *War and Pieced* was a stunning exhibition and unique showcase of spectacularly complex geometric quilts made from military fabrics by soldiers and military tailors in the time of war. Once termed "soldiers' quilts" or "convalescent quilts," the pieced textiles in this exhibition are associated with World War I and World War II as well as the earliest quilts from the Napoleonic wars, the late eighteenth century, conflicts in India, South Africa and wars during the nineteenth century. A highly successful exhibition with a Grand Total of 3465 visitors, 12 groups attended with additional volunteers deployed for orientation and security.



Public Programs

Dr Annette Gero was the Guest Speaker at the exhibition opening on Friday, 22 February 2019, introduced by Cr Bill West, Mayor of Cowra. Members of the Cowra RSL Sub-branch were invited and attended the opening event. Dr Gero presented a Public Lecture at the Cowra Civic Centre Theatrette on Saturday 23 February 2019. The lecture was well attended with over 75 people present followed by afternoon tea and book signings.

There are only about 100 known in the world and no one knows why these quilts were made or what they were used for, or why the patterns are so visually extraordinary.

2019 Calleen Art Award

The Calleen Art Award encourages originality, creativity and artistic excellence and is an acquisitive national painting prize in any subject and style established in 1977 by Mrs Patricia Fagan OAM. The winner of the 2019 Calleen Art Award Wendy Sharpe from Sydney, NSW, received \$20,000 in prize money made possible by the generous support of the Calleen Trust. Sharpe's winning work *Erskineville Train Station* 2019 joined The Calleen Collection at the Cowra Regional Art Gallery.



ACP Outreach Weekend Photography Workshop 'Re-imagine Your Landscape '






Set amongst the vast and diverse landscape of Cowra, this weekend photography workshop introduced participants to the technical and practical approaches required to capture magical landscapes such as composition and technical aspects including equipment such as filters and lens, angles of view and depth of field. Lachlan Valley Biennial Art Awards

The 2019 Lachlan Valley Biennial Art Awards focuses on artists living within a radius of 100 kilometres from Cowra. The exhibition is a community partnership between the Gallery and Cowra Art Group, and is the ninth time the Gallery has hosted this regional art event. Over 120 entries are usually received for exhibition, with artists from Young, Boorowa, Grenfell, Parkes, Forbes, Bathurst, Orange and Canowindra. The exhibition includes painting, drawing, watercolour, and miniatures. A community project in collaboration with the Cowra Art Group.

2019 upstART – Exhibition and Awards

This was the 17th annual youth art exhibition and awards presented by the Cowra Regional Art Gallery. The exhibition consisted of works by young artists in years 10, 11 and 12 from high schools in the Central West. Categories included painting, drawing, mixed media, ceramics, photography and sculpture.

The 2019 *upstART* exhibition showed an impressive display of painting, drawing, photography, printmaking, mixed media and sculpture by over 80 students from nine high schools in the region. The participating schools were: Boorowa Central School, Canowindra High School, Cowra High School, Dubbo School of Distance Education, Hennessy Catholic College, Parkes High School, The Henry Lawson High School, St Raphael's Catholic School and Young High School.
