

FROM THE GALLERY DIRECTOR

Welcome to the Summer 2020/2021 edition of the Cowra Regional Art Gallery Newsletter. If you are a local resident and have some free time this summer, or if you are on holidays in Cowra, why not visit the Art Gallery's carefully curated summer program of inspired exhibitions and summer holiday activities.

Commencing on 13 December 2020 the Gallery is presenting the exhibition **Yvonne Boag: Travelling, Leaving, Settling, Scotland, Korea, Australia** featuring paintings, works on paper and artist's books by artist Yvonne Boag, who has divided her time between South Korea and Australia for the past 20 years. Exhibition guest curator is Akky van Ogtrop, art historian and curator.

Scottish born printmaker, painter and sculptor Yvonne Boag arrived with her family in South Australia in 1964. This relocation to another continent at the age of ten had a profound effect on Boag's future life as an artist, and how she dealt with themes of displacement and migration in her work. An online streaming event with the artist and curator talking about the exhibition will take place on the Gallery Facebook page from 2pm on Saturday 12 December and will be available to view on the Gallery website at a later date.

The second exhibition commencing 13 December is **The Collection in Focus: Recent Acquisitions** showcasing works of art received by the Gallery as gifts and donations during the past three years. Both

of these "must-see" exhibitions will close on Sunday 7 February 2021.

The annual Children's Summer Art Workshops for 7 to 12 year olds will take place on 21 and 22 January 2021. Book early as places are limited (please see the page opposite for more information).

Commencing 14 February to 21 March 2021 the Cowra Regional Art Gallery is presenting a major touring exhibition from JamFactory Adelaide (Arts Centre) titled **CONCRETE: art design architecture.** This exhibition has been supported by Visions of Australia funding through Australian Government's Department of Communications and Arts and the South Australian Government through the Department for Innovation and Skills.

Yvonne Boag: Travelling, Leaving, Settling, Scotland, Korea, Australia: Paintings, Works on Paper and Artists Books

For more than 20 years, Yvonne Boag has divided her time between South Korea and Australia, spending seven months each year in Seoul. Dealing with themes of displacement and alienation, this exhibition intends to focus on Boag's artworks depicting her own personal experiences with migration, immersed in the deep links and multi-layered relationships between Scotland, Korea and Australia.
